

# Requirements for the Organ Movie

The purpose of the organ movie is to *teach* the class about your organ. Your movie *must*:

- Have *at least* six pictures of your organ.
- Have narration as a part of your movie.
- Include transitions between *at least* 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of your pictures.
- You may use another movie as a part of your presentation. If the movie has narration, it *must* be used as a summary. It *cannot* be a major part of your presentation.
- Have titles on *at least* 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of your pictures.
- Include music.

Your movie *must* include the following information:

- Which organ system contains your organ?
- What is your organ's main function(s)?
- How does your organ work to keep your body healthy?
- What diseases or disorders affect your organ?
- Can a person live without your organ?

Take time to put your movie together. You want a professional looking, smooth running movie.

Remember, the purpose of your movie is to teach the class about the assigned organ. Merely putting up a picture of the organ *does not* teach anyone anything about your organ.
